**AGRSS TO PRESENT CODE OF ETHICS**  
**Code to be Released at November Conference**

The Auto Glass Replacement Safety Standards Council Inc. (AGRSS) will focus portions of the 2008 International Auto Glass Safety Conference on its new code of ethics. The conference will be held November 5 - 6 at the Mandalay Bay Convention Center in Las Vegas during Auto Glass Week™ in conjunction with the International Autobody Congress and Exposition ([NACE](#)).

The AGRSS Council has created an AGRSS Code of Ethics to work along side its ANSI-approved AGRSS Standard and will present the code during its November conference. The code will contain behavior and business practices to be expected of all AGRSS-registered shops.

“It is our belief that AGRSS-registered companies cannot completely place a technical emphasis on consumer safety without also taking parallel steps with their professionalism,” says Jean Pero of Mygrant Glass, who serves as chair of the subcommittee working on the Code. “The two go hand-in-hand and it is time we addressed industry professionalism with a Code of Ethics.”

AGRSS Conference attendees will receive two full days of quality education on important industry topics; networking opportunities with colleagues and related industry peers; admission to the AGRSS welcoming cocktail party and charity auction; admission to the NACE trade show; admission to the [Auto Glass Technician Olympics](#); and admission to the [Walt Gorman Memorial Windshield Repair Olympics](#) all for one registration fee.

The pre-registration rate for AGRSS-Registered company attendees is \$150; non-registered companies will be charged \$225 per attendee. Pre-registration closes October 17.
