NWRA Announces 2009 Association Officers

The National Windshield Repair Association (NWRA) announced today the election of officers for its 2009 board of directors.

Mike Boyle, president of GlasWeld Inc. in Bend, Ore., was elected president of the association's board of directors. Boyle was elected to the board in 2008 and had served in that capacity in the past. He will be taking over the presidency from Paul Syfko of Glass Medic America, who now is past-president.
