**SECOND INTERIM APPLICATION OF YOUNG CONAWAY
STARGATT & TAYLOR, LLP FOR COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES
RENDERED AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES AS COUNSEL
TO THE DEBTORS AND DEBTORS IN POSSESSION FOR THE
PERIOD FROM MAY 1, 2008 THROUGH MAY 31, 2008**

Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 330 and 331 and Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, the law firm of Young Conaway Stargatt & Taylor, LLP (hereinafter, “YCST”) hereby seeks reasonable compensation for professional legal services rendered as counsel to the above-captioned Debtors and Debtors in possession (the “Debtors”) in the amount of \$75,284.00 together with reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the amount of \$12,814.18 for the period commencing May 1, 2008 through and including May 31, 2008 (the “Fee Period”). In support of its Application, YCST respectfully represents as follows:

1. YCST was employed under a general retainer to represent the Debtors as bankruptcy counsel in connection with these chapter 11 cases, pursuant to an Order entered by this Court on April 23, 2008. The Order authorized YCST to be compensated on an hourly basis and to be reimbursed for actual and necessary out-of-pocket expenses.

COMPENSATION PAID AND ITS SOURCE

2. All services for which compensation is requested by YCST were performed for or on behalf of the Debtors.

3. Attached hereto as Exhibits A and B are detailed statements of fees and expenses incurred during the period of May 1, 2008 through May 31, 2008 showing the amount of \$75,284.00 due for fees and \$12,814.18 for reimbursement of expenses.

SUMMARY OF SERVICES RENDERED

4. The attorneys of YCST who have rendered professional services in these cases during the Fee Period are Michael R. Nestor, Curtis J. Crowther, Joseph M. Barry, Scott A. Holt, Donald J. Bowman, Jr., Kara Hammond Coyle, and Robert F. Poppiti. Paraprofessional services were provided by Michelle Smith, Melissa Bertsch, and Anastasia Joseck.

5. The services rendered by YCST during the Fee Period are grouped into the categories set forth in Exhibit A. The attorneys, paralegals and paraprofessionals who rendered services relating to each category are identified, along with the number of hours for each individual and the total compensation sought for each category, in the attachments hereto.

DISBURSEMENTS

6. YCST has incurred out-of-pocket disbursements during the Fee Period in the amount of \$75,284.00. This disbursement sum is broken down into categories of charges, including, among other things, telephone and telecopier toll and other charges, mail or express mail charges, special or hand delivery charges, document processing, photocopying charges, charges for mailing supplies (including, without limitation, envelopes

and labels) provided by YCST to outside copying services for use in mass mailings, transcription costs, as well as non-ordinary overhead expenses such as secretarial and other overtime. A complete review by category of the expenses incurred for the Fee Period may be found in the attachments hereto as Exhibit B.

7. Costs incurred for overtime and computer assisted research are not included in YCST's normal hourly billing rates, and therefore, are itemized and included in YCST's disbursements. Pursuant to Del. Bankr. L.R. 2016-2(e), YCST represents that its rate for duplication is \$.10 per page, its rate for outgoing telecopier transmissions is \$1.00 per page (excluding related long distance transmission charges), there is no charge for incoming telecopier transmissions and there is no surcharge for computerized research.

VALUATION OF SERVICES

8. Attorneys, paralegals and paraprofessionals of YCST have expended a total of 237.60 hours in connection with this matter during the Fee Period.

9. The amount of time spent by each of these persons providing services to the Debtors for the Fee Period is fully set forth in the summary attached hereto as Exhibit A. These are YCST's normal hourly rates of compensation for work of this character. The reasonable value of the services rendered by YCST for the Period as counsel for the Debtors in this case under Chapter 11 is \$75,284.00.

10. YCST believes that the time entries included in Exhibit A attached hereto are in compliance with the requirements of Del. Bankr. L.R. 2016-2(d).


11. In accordance with the factors enumerated in 11 U.S.C. § 330, the amount requested is fair and reasonable given (a) the complexity of this case, (b) the time

expended, (c) the nature and extent of the services rendered, (d) the value of such services, and (e) the costs of comparable services other than in a case under this title.

12. This Application covers the period May 1, 2008 through and including May 31, 2008. YCST has and will continue to perform additional necessary services subsequent to May 31, 2008, for which YCST will file subsequent fee applications.

WHEREFORE, YCST requests that allowance be made to it in the sum of \$75,284.00 as compensation for necessary professional services rendered to the Debtors for the Fee Period, and the sum of \$12,814.18 for reimbursement of actual necessary costs and expenses incurred during that period, and further requests such other and further relief as this Court may deem just and proper.


